On my wonderful working holiday in Manila as Rotary Ambassadorial Scholar on a Rotary Grant, I was almost in heaven. I had American dollar scholarship, 8000 pesos hotel, Chinese car, very aggressive and welcoming District 3810, country like and Lakerella students, malls for shopping and shops across the island with Filipino hospitality. Well, I could hardly ask for more. However on my 3 month hotel visit in the 1966 week on a Sunday, I woke up with Thalassemia disease and lacking roof and not carpet. I was rattled and lost. Considering the first week, I knew that all the rooms were leaking the lobby was flooded with water and most of Manila did not have electricity or clean drinking water. The visibility was poor and typhoon had struck the bay. Signal 7 was flashed on the radio, telling people not to go out at all.

However knowing all the chaos my phone rang and innerwheel member Edna who I had just met previous day in the national innerwheel conference was calling and inquiring about my safety. I was indeed shocked and she offered to take me to her home and insisted that I pack an overnight bag. Though she arrived in a high van to pick me up, midway the van stopped and last 50 yards we had to paddle through the water to her house.

On learning that I was vegetarian she emptied her fridge and made her husband walk a mile to get bread and fruits for me. But we sat and talked while the rain finished on the windows, lightning striking the neighbourhood and we sat with our coffee mug in our hand sharing our life story and forming a life long bond.

Next day on going out of the second home we realized that neighbourhood situation were completely ravaged by the typhoon and there were roofless homes and we three of us ran back to the house and distributed bread and fruits to the people who were shivering in the rain and boiled some water and filled them in the bottles for the children. We contacted our other innerwheel members and soon by evening we had enough food and blankets for the people who suddenly had no roof over their head. I can still remember the grateful tears in the eyes of the mother of an infant.

Thus I ended my wonderful Ambassadorial red carpet trip with fond memories and firmer belief that strangers can be friends and together we can make a difference.
